WELCOME TO ROME - OVERVIEW

Rome

Rome is a city with an artistic heritage dating back to Etruscan times; the city is full of masterpieces, particularly from the ancient, Renaissance and Baroque eras.

Rome is famous for its squares, churches and fountains. The best way to see the sights is as a pedestrian. Walk around the centre and you will encounter great works of art such as sculptures by Michelangelo, paintings by Caravaggio, frescoes by Raphael and fountains by Bernini. In Rome art is not locked away from view, it is all around you. But be careful, traffic, especially scooters, can be erratic and pedestrians often have to fend for themselves.

The two most popular tourist destinations in Rome are the Vatican Museums and the Colosseum. Other popular sites include St Peter's Basilica, Foro Romano, Pantheon, Trevi Fountain, Spanish Steps, Capitoline Museums, Villa Borghese, Piazza Navona, Castel Sant'Angelo and Campo de' Fiori.

ELECTRICITY, GAS AND WATER

Electricity

Standard electricity supply is 220 Volts (V), 50 Hertz (Hz). The rental agency or real estate agent will be able to provide contacts for the area.

The basic electricity contract in Italy is set up to provide approximately 3 to 3.2 kilowatts; a larger supply (up to 6 kilowatts) can be requested.

The bill is generally paid every two months. The meters are read once a year and adjusted bills sent out.

Electricity costs vary depending on the time of use; i.e. more expensive from 8:00 to 19:00 on working days, when demand and costs are higher.

Gas

Gas is widely used for heating, water heating and cooking appliances throughout Italy. Gas is available in three forms:

- Mains gas distributed by Italgas and Acea Energia
- Bottled gas
- Outdoors gas tank

A new tenant or property owner should contact Italgas or Acea Energia to have the meter read and gas turned on. The bill is every two months and payments can be made by direct debit or at the post office.

If central gas is not available you will need bottled gas or an outdoors gas tank.

Water

Every municipality has its own water company. The water supply is controlled by the *Comune di Roma*. Water is usually billed twice a year with an "estimate". When the meter is read, an adjusted bill is sent. At this point it is recommended to confirm the reading to make sure the figures are correct.

Generally, residents of apartments and condominiums will pay the water bill as part of the fees, no special arrangements are needed.

BANKS AND POSTAL SERVICES

Banks

Banks are usually open Monday to Friday in the morning from 8:30 to 13:30.

In the afternoon, the opening hours change from bank to bank, but they are usually open from Monday to Friday from 14:30 to 15:00 or from 16:00 to 16:30.

Outside most banks there is a cash machine. Some cash machines in the center of Rome also have an automatic currency exchange working 24 hours a day.

In Rome, shops almost always have a credit card service, but remember that some small shops, stalls in markets, rooms for rent or Bed & Breakfasts often do not provide a credit card service.

At FAO Headquarters, two banks are available with Bancomat (ATM) facilities situated outside:

- Banca Intesa San Paolo is located on the ground floor, Building B.
- Banca Popolare di Sondrio is located on the ground floor, Building D.

Postal Services

The Italian postal service provides a bill paying service widely used for making regular payments for services: gas, electricity, telephone, insurance, rent, road tax and television license fees. A pre-printed form (bollettino postale) will arrive with the bill. This should include all payment details. The teller will process the payment and give you a receipt as proof of payment. In addition, the post office offers financial products and the possibility to open current accounts and a range of pre-paid cards that can be recharged and used in Italy and abroad.

In the city center several post offices are open from Monday to Friday from 8:30 to 18:30, and on Saturday mornings from 8:30 to 13:00.

TRANSPORT

Airports

Rome has two main international airports:

Leonardo da Vinci/Fiumicino International Airport (Rome Fiumicino) - Rome's biggest and main airport is modern and well connected to the centre of the city by public transport.

Ciampino International Airport (Rome Ciampino - located to the southeast of the capital). This is Rome's low-cost airline airport. This small airport has no direct train connection. However there is a regular shuttle bus service.

Car

Rome and other Italian cities have restricted driving zones to reduce traffic congestion and pollution, called ZTL (Limited Traffic Zone). The historical center is checked by an electronic access gates system in order to limit private vehicle access.

Car Sharing

Car sharing provides individual, but shared, means of transport. Following registration, users can book a car when they need it, without the costs and charges of owning and running a car. Users collectively access a car fleet spread around the city. A single car is made available to multiple users who have registered with the Service. So, an individual car is driven by more than one user at various times of the day.

Economy cars/runabouts and vans are available. The vehicles can be used 24/24h, 365 days over the year, whenever you need one:

Metro and Buses

Rome has four metro lines, A, B, B1 and C.

Rome's public transport uses Metrobus tickets, which have to be validated whilst getting on buses and before getting on the metro and trains. Tickets can be bought at newsstands, bars and vending machines and on some buses.

Food

When in Rome, there is one thing you will not have to worry about: being able to find a good place to eat. Food and wine are central to Roman social life and there are plenty of pizzerias, trattorias, restaurants and gelaterie (ice-cream shops).

Attractions near Rome

There are many attractions to visit outside of Rome too. Many neighbouring towns and historic ruins enjoy sizeable visitor numbers and are well connected by public transport.

Shopping

Shops in Rome are usually open from 9:00 to 13:00 and from 15:30 to 19:30 (16:00 and 20:00 in summer), except on Sunday and Monday mornings. Grocery shops close on Thursday afternoons. Some bookshops and clothes shops, normally in the town centre, are open on Sundays.

Rome has several shopping centres:

- Euroma2: 240 shops from home furnishing to footwear, bars and restaurants.
- Maximo: 160 shops, a big supermarket, a cinema, a gym, bar and restaurants. These include Decathlon, Maison du Monde and others.
- Porta Di Roma: 220 shops, a 14-screen cinema, bar and restaurants. These include IKEA, Auchan, Decathlon Sport and others.
- Castel Romano Designer Outlet: Items from previous seasons with prices reduced by 30%-70% all year round.
- Valmontone Outlet: About 40 Km from Rome where you can find many shops stocking fashion labels.
- Parco Leonardo: Located near Fiumicino Airport, it features 216 shops, a 24screen cinema and a bowling alley.

There are a variety of flea or outdoor markets and places to buy antiques in Rome:

- **Porta Portese**, open on Sundays from 7:00 until 14:00, is the most important flea market in Rome and one of the largest in Europe. At Porta Portese, you will find everything from antique housewares to second-hand clothing and music to original art, jewellery, posters, furniture, etc.
- Another well-known flea market is located just a few blocks south of the Basilica di San Giovanni Laterano (Via Sannio). This market sells clothing and accessories and is open from Monday to Saturday, morning only.
- **Food markets** can be found in every district of Rome and are called "mercati rionali". They are often the social centre of the district. Despite the supermarkets and "ipermercati" this tradition remains almost unchanged today. Full of colour and variety, Rome's food markets are a great place to find fresh fruits and vegetables, flowers, fish and meat.
